

## 10 Reasons Why Angola Is Worth a Visit



### **Kalandula Falls – The Victoria Falls Without the Crowds**

Located in northwestern Angola, the Kalandula Falls are the second-largest waterfalls in Africa after Victoria Falls. Dropping about 105 meters into a dramatic gorge and surrounded by lush greenery, they flow year-round – unlike the Victoria Falls, which can dry up during certain seasons.



### **Pedras Negras (Black Rocks) in Pungo Andongo**

These monumental rock formations rise majestically from the savanna and are steeped in legends from the ancient Kingdom of Ndongo. A must-see for anyone interested in both nature and history.



### **Namibe Desert – Dunes, Coastlines, and Natural Wonders**

In southwestern Angola, the Namibe region combines desert landscapes with spectacular coastal scenery. Highlights include the Iona Nature Reserve, home to unique flora and fauna, dramatic rock formations, and vast dunes that create an unforgettable natural experience.



### **Kissama National Park – Safari in Untouched Nature**

Guided safaris offer sightings of elephants, giraffes, zebras, and numerous bird species. Boat trips along the Kwanza River reveal crocodiles, hippos, and other fascinating wildlife.



### **Cabinda Enclave – Rainforest and Western Lowland Gorillas**

This remote province is famous for its lush rainforests, such as the Mayombe Forest. Rare species, including the Western Lowland Gorilla, inhabit this area. The coastline also offers idyllic beaches and excellent conditions for boat excursions.



### **Miradouro da Lua – Angola’s Lunar Landscape**

This geological formation in southern Angola features bizarrely shaped cliffs and hills that resemble the surface of the moon. A spectacular viewpoint for photographers and nature enthusiasts.



### **Tundavala Gorge – Dramatic Views from the Huila Plateau**

The deep gorge provides breathtaking panoramas of the surrounding landscapes and is considered one of Angola’s most impressive natural wonders.



### **Experience Traditional Tribes – Culture Up Close**

Visitors can meet Khoisan communities, admire their craftsmanship, and immerse themselves in vibrant traditions – offering an authentic insight into Angola’s rich cultural heritage.



### **Dream Beaches – Baía Azul and Mussulo Peninsula**

These coastal gems boast paradise-like beaches, untouched coral reefs, and opportunities for diving and snorkeling. Ideal for both sunseekers and adventurers.
